- ❖ He has been offered many jobs with other NGOs (£ 2,650 pa)
- ❖ We are lucky to have him in charge of the projects



Rameshwar Lal snippets



- ❖ PM Modi hiked taxes (GST)
- ❖ Jeewan Jyoti (brick houses) were £ 330 now £ 1,666
- ❖ Unskilled labour was £ 1.60 per day but now £ 5 per day





Rameshwar Lal snippets



- ❖ Straw now the same price as stone so using stone for roofs!





Rameshwar Lal snippets



- ❖ Prime Minister Modi's "Demonetisation" in 2016 had an unintended consequence for women.....
- ❖ Their "Rainy Day", "Independence" fund was exposed.....



Rameshwar Lal snippets



- ❖ Sanitary towels
- ❖ Were ordering 5 boxes; now 20 boxes
- ❖ < 1p each. Girls are given 4 per month
- ❖ Rameshwar Lal's team will do training on washable Sanitary Towels





Rameshwar Lal snippets



- ❖ Local and National Governments have started publishing benefits they give on walls and houses
- ❖ Supposed to stop double claiming





In 2018 the Prime minister of the Girls' Parliament lives there!













How have our projects helped you?

❖ All children going to school

❖ Change in living standard

Clothes

Health

Homes

❖ Changed the way we talk to each other

We meet together as a community

A lot of quarrelling before; now understand other's point of view

❖ Used to use untrained midwife: now we go straight to hospital for births

❖ If we are ill, we go to the hospital

❖ Used to have a bath every 8-10 days; now DAILY!

❖ 2 children per family; were 11-13. "We couldn't give them food".

❖ We now have many water tanks

❖ We have learnt new skills

❖ We learn a lot from the monthly meetings




Water Update





NOTHING is possible without water



Providing water makes people more receptive to other programmes and social change





**If no water from
Khandel light:**

Villagers would drink dirty saline water and become ill

Only other option would be to move to Jaipur and greater poverty



Where does the water come from?

- ❖ Currently 3 km from Khandel
- ❖ Gradually becomes more saline
- ❖ Distance to water source increases
- ❖ Cost depends on distance
- ❖ £ 2.50 to £4.50 per tanker
- ❖ This family owns 2 wells and sells water at 88p per 5,000 litre tanker
- ❖ 80-90 tankers per day





13 Water Houses built in the last year

Each one costs £133

(Excludes labour which is usually the beneficiary's contribution)





Rameshwar Lal's home in nearby town of Phulera:

- ❖ 2 water pipes (because 2 families and needs to have guests)
- ❖ Rs 300 per month for each pipe
- ❖ 30 minutes water every 48 hours (sometimes 60 hours and occasionally 5 days)
- ❖ Water from 300 km away-pipeline gets sabotaged or broken


Some of the topics raised

- ✦ Dowry system “Parents say we invest in boys but we donate a girl”
- ✦ Selective abortion and sex ratio girls to boys (800/1000)
- ✦ Girls’ status should be recognised
- ✦ Sexual harassment and abuse- families and family friends
- ✦ Passive smoking and alcohol abuse in families
- ✦ Child marriage
- ✦ Education- importance of educating girls
- ✦ Importance of girls’ groups outside family


