The excitement and optimism resulting from these new and very marketable skills was tangible and infectious.

Khandel light is a local international development charity formed in 2000 to encourage and facilitate the desire of many people, in the new millennium, to tackle global poverty in a direct, responsive and sustainable way. Poverty is more than a lack of money; it is also a lack of capability and opportunity.

Through the harnessing of skills and influence in our local and extended community, Khandel light has enabled thousands of people in rural India (home to a third of the world's poor) to move from simply trying to survive to a belief that they can realise their dreams.

After addressing, the basic needs of water, sanitation and housing we have particularly focussed on the education of young people and the inequalities of caste and gender. When we first became involved with our adopted community of 35,000 people, as few as 40% of girls went to school and girls as young as 10 were getting married. Now, 100% of girls go to school and it is rare for any girl under the age of 18 to marry.

Through educational bursaries and recently initiated vocational training courses, we are ensuring a sustainable, independent and fulfilling future for hundreds of young people and their communities.
